

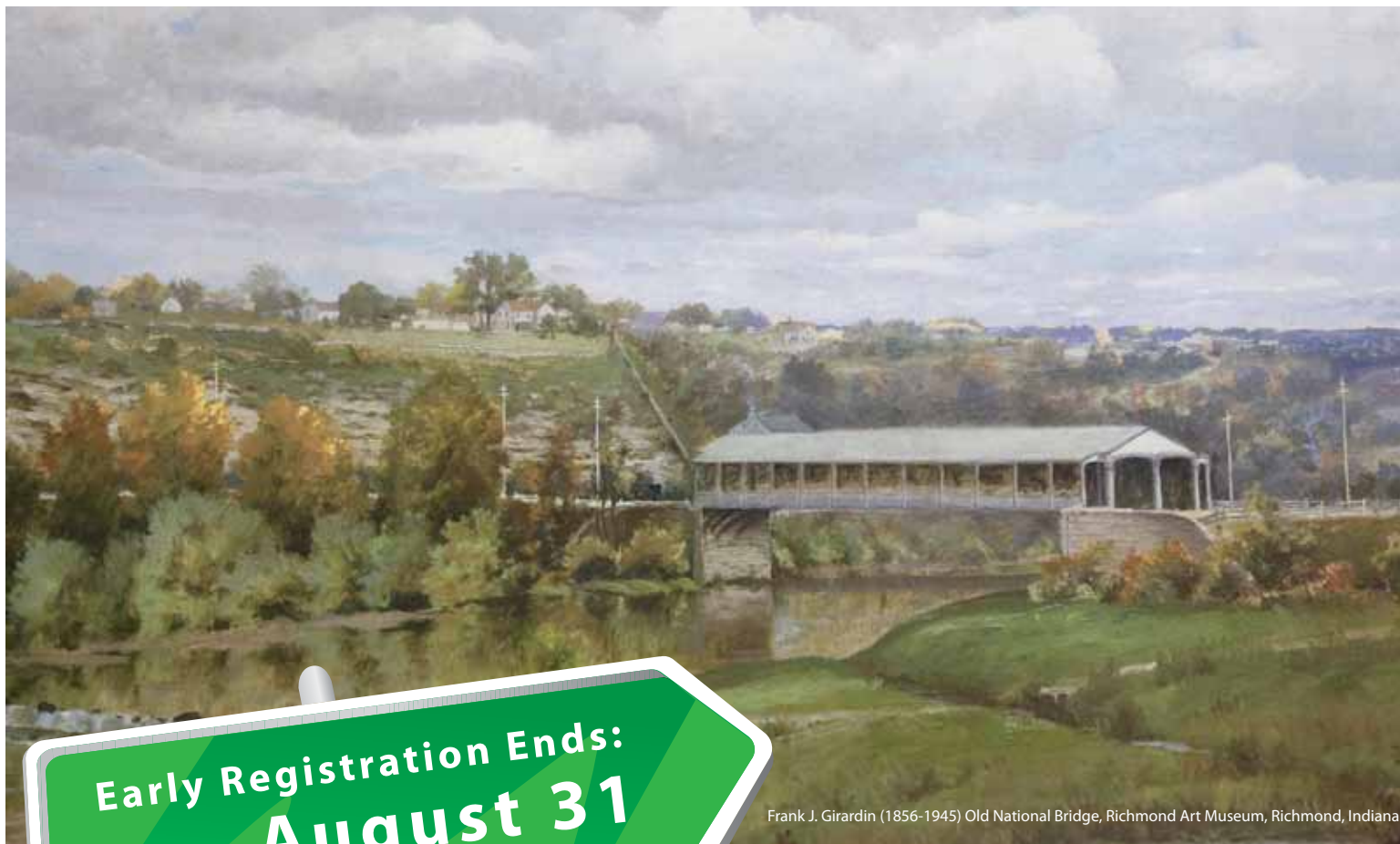

Conference Itinerary

Crossroads of History Tour:

The tour begins at the Wayne County Historical Museum. Next we'll head to the Gaar Mansion, one of the few house museums in America with all of its original contents. We conclude at the Levi Coffin House, honored in 2010 by AASLH's Albert Corey Award.

Community Partnership Tour:

Visits the Starr-Gennett development, including one of the original Starr piano factory buildings, in Whitewater Gorge. Then to Richmond Community Schools building, which houses the art museum, the symphony, and a performing art center. Next, a trip to the Joseph Moore Museum, established by Earlham College in 1847 as a teaching collection. Finally, discover Cope Environmental Center's Sustainable Living Demonstration Home, and the array of partnerships which made it possible.

National Road Tour:

Travel Route 40 past many Richmond-area sights, including the Madonna of the Trail, Millionaire's Row, and Earlham College. Tours will be given at Mansion House, an early Centerville tavern/inn with an adjacent log-built courthouse. Next is the Overbeck Museum in Cambridge City Library. The final stop will be the Huddleston Farmhouse Inn and Museum, which has just re-opened to the public with a new interpretive center.

6-9pm Dinner at the Firehouse BBQ and Blues

Dinner, relaxing and networking at the The Firehouse BBQ and Blues, Richmond's oldest firehouse, newly restored by firefighters into a restaurant. Located in the historic Depot District, there are great, new murals painted on the walls, inside and out, of firehouse images. Dinner cost not included in conference registration fees.

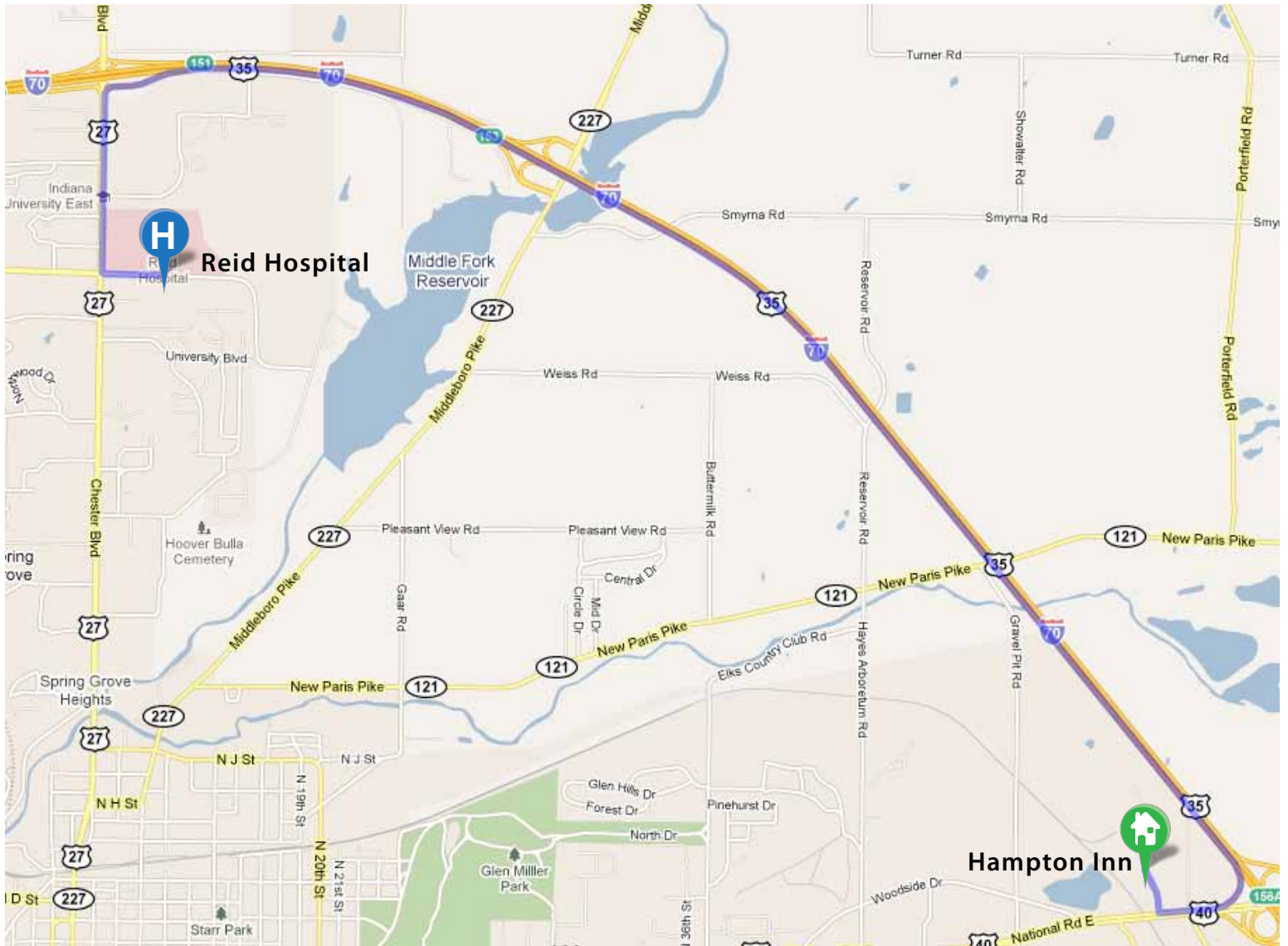

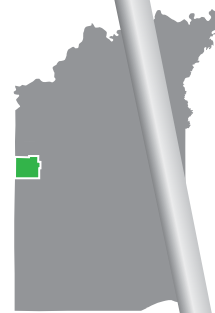
